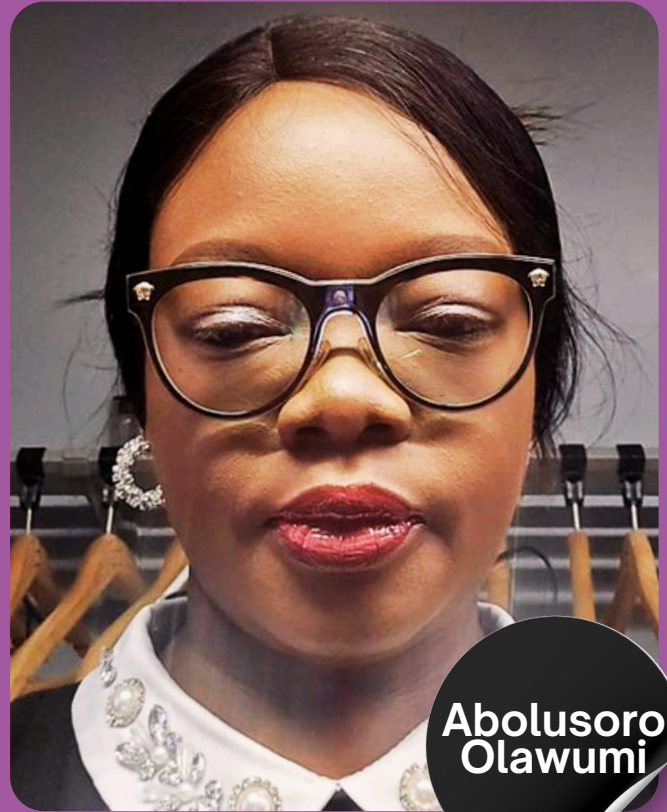

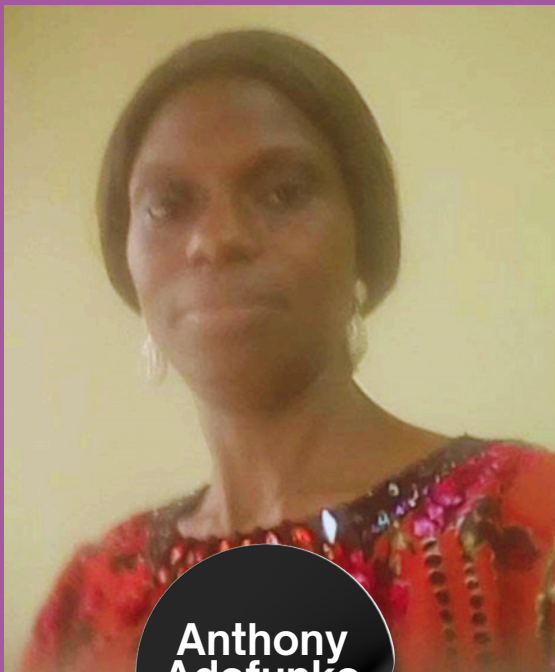

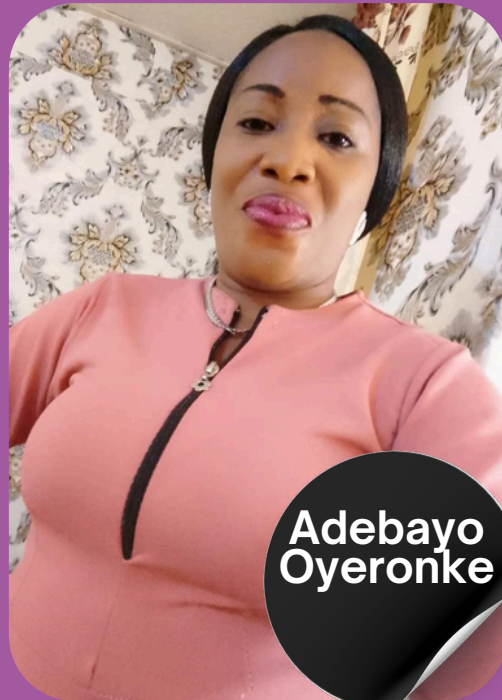
ACCELERATE ACTION
